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The professionalization of civil society organisations and the work they carry out is an inescapable process in an increasingly competitive context. Adaptation to changing challenges: social problems and community needs can evolve over time. Professional organizations have the ability to adapt and respond effectively to these context changes, ensuring that their work remains relevant and effective.

Normative compliance: Professionalization can help organizations comply with applicable legal and fiscal regulations, which avoids legal problems and ensures that the organization can continue operating without interruption.

Independence: the professionalization of civil society organizations also contributes to their greater independence from corporate and political interests.

Competitiveness: Civil society organisations should not forget that they operate in a highly competitive sector. Compete by audience, by donors... Their professionalization is precisely the best guarantee of their competitiveness.
